Craig D. Robins of Huntington has been honored for his volunteer pro bono work in bankruptcy actions by the Volunteer Lawyers Project of the Nassau County Bar Association. Robins, whose Westbury practice relates primarily to bankruptcy and debt-related matters, has accepted about 65 pro bono cases within the past 12 years. A member of both the Nassau County Bar Association in Mineola and the Suffolk County Bar Association in Hauppauge, Robins serves on the bankruptcy committee of both bar associations. His articles on bankruptcy law issues have appeared in the Nassau Lawyer and Suffolk Lawyer journals and he has spoken on the subject at public functions and on radio and television. He has served on the Nassau County Bar Association's Blue Ribbon Committee on Lawyer Advertising and on the Suffolk County Bar Association's Mentor Program. A 1981 graduate of Emory University in Atlanta, he received his juris doctorate in 1984 from Western New England School of Law in Springfield, Mass. He also took courses at the University of Notre Dame School of Law in South Bend, Ind., and the Concannon Program of International Law in London. An avid photographer and bicycle road racer for about 30 years, he has won the 15-mile race at Cedar Creek Park in Wantagh and the 30-mile race at Suffolk Community College in Riverhead.
